Seasonal Allergies and Oral Health

There's a lot to like about autumn — pumpkin patches, sweater weather, sunset-hued leaves on the trees. But when the seasons shift, many people experience an increase in sneezing and sniffing. Environmental allergies can make you very uncomfortable, and unfortunately, they pose a few problems for your oral health, too.

Common fall allergens like ragweed pollen, mold spores and dust mites cause runny noses and watery eyes. Although these allergens don't directly harm your teeth and mouth, allergy symptoms may indirectly cause oral health issues, including dry mouth, bad breath and tooth pain.

Allergies and Oral Health: Dry Mouth

Dry mouth shows up with seasonal allergies for several reasons. For one, dry mouth is a side effect of many medications, including antihistamines. People with allergies often use antihistamines to treat sneezing, watery eyes and other symptoms.

Also, people who are struggling with allergies tend to breathe through their mouths more because allergies make noses runny and stuffy. More mouth breathing dries out the saliva from your mouth.

Saliva has several important functions to your oral health outside of simply keeping your mouth comfortable. It washes away leftover food from your teeth, reduces cavity-causing acids from your mouth and even helps you digest your food. When you don't have enough saliva in your mouth, your risk for cavities and gum disease goes up.

If you experience dry mouth, you have several easy strategies to combat it. Simply drinking water or chewing sugar-free gum keep saliva levels healthy. Sleeping near a humidifier may also provide relief.

Allergies and Oral Health: Bad Breath

Post-nasal drip is a common allergy symptom, and this leads to more bad-breath bacteria in your mouth. In addition to sticking to a solid at-home dental care routine — that is, brushing and flossing twice daily — using mouthwash, taking frequent water breaks and chewing sugar-free gum will help keep breath fresh throughout the day.

Allergies and Oral Health: Tooth Pain

Allergies can send mucous production into high gear, which can put a lot of pressure on your sinuses. Your sinuses sit just above your mouth, so some allergy sufferers may feel pain in their top teeth. If you experience tooth pain, give your dentist or personal doctor a call, as they may recommend medications to relieve the pressure and pain on your mouth.

Keep Your Mouth Healthy During Allergy Season

Now that you know how fall allergies can affect your oral health, you can proactively address these problems before they become bigger issues.
